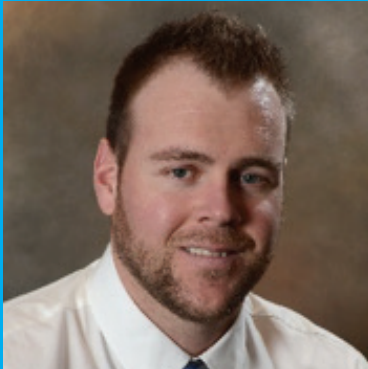

ACWWA Annual Conference 2018 Keynote Address

JEREMY WHITE, Keynote Speaker

Jeremy White is Founder & Alesmith of Big Spruce Brewing in Nyanza, Cape Breton. Prior to starting Big Spruce with his wife Melanie, he was a headhunter for New York's JR Partners, recruiting for the financial sector in New York, London, and Asia. Previous to that, he worked in business development and operations across Latin America and the Caribbean for Biwater International Ltd.

Big Spruce Brewing is the first Certified Organic, on-farm craft brewery and hop yard in Atlantic Canada. With 11 year-round employees, and 4 summer seasonal gigs, the brewery has grown from its original 7 barrel facility producing 80,000 litres per year - to now include a second 40 barrel brewery across the road. Production in 2017 jumped to 350,000 litres. An automated canning line, a robust award-winning barrel aging program, and a four-season tasting patio have made Big Spruce a must for every craft beer fan.

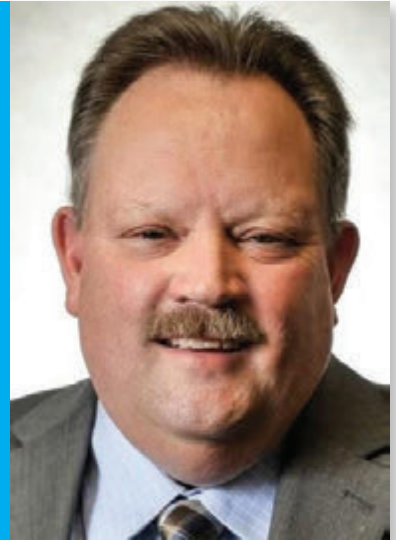

Jackie Jarrell, P.E., is the 2017-2018 Vice President of the Water Environment Federation (WEF), an international organization of water quality professionals headquartered in Alexandria, Virginia.

Jackie has been with Charlotte Water for more than 25 years. For the past 15 years, she has been responsible for the overall management of the operation and maintenance of five wastewater treatment facilities consisting of a total capacity of 123 million gallons per day (MGD), with the largest plant permitted at 64 MGD. She is also responsible for the related Residuals Program, producing more than 90,000 wet tons/year, and the Industrial Pretreatment Program, with more than 60 significant industrial users. Recently, Jackie serves as the Operations Chief responsible for wastewater operations, and includes oversight of regulatory functions, process control, industrial pretreatment, and continuous improvement programs within the operation's areas.

As a WEF member, Jackie has held multiple leadership and committee roles, including serving as the chair of the Utility Management Program Symposia and the first vice chair of the Utility Management Committee.

Also an active member of the North Carolina Water Environment Association (NCWEA), Jackie helped develop NCWEA's strategic plan in 2013 and is the current chair of the Nominating Committee. She has also chaired the Public Education Committee, the Annual Conference Committee, and the Program Committee. In 2013, Jackie served as the Member Association chair and worked on related subcommittees such as Water for People (including a trip to Bolivia in 2011), the Wastewater Schools Committee, the Endowment Committee, and the Plant Operations Committee. She is actively involved with the North Carolina Water Quality Association, a regulatory advocacy organization of utilities in North Carolina, and is a past chair and a current board member.

Jackie is a registered professional engineer in the state of North Carolina and holds a Biological Wastewater Grade II Operator in Training. She received a Bachelor of Science in engineering from the University of North Carolina-Charlotte. Jackie is the 2014 recipient of the Arthur Sidney Bedell Award. In 2015, Jackie, along with her colleagues, was awarded the Gascoigne Wastewater Treatment Plant Operational Improvement Medal.

Come and find out who has the best tasting water in Atlantic Canada!

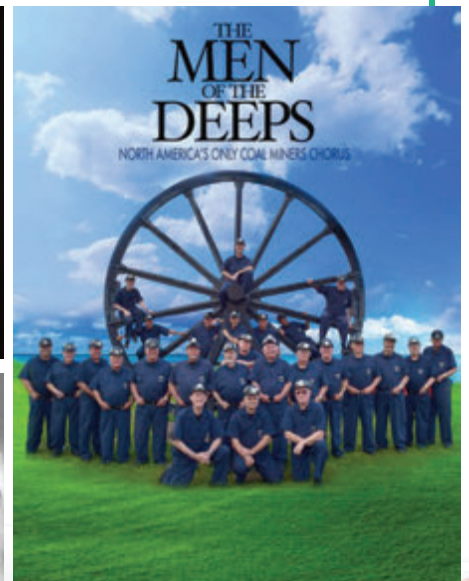

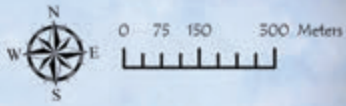
