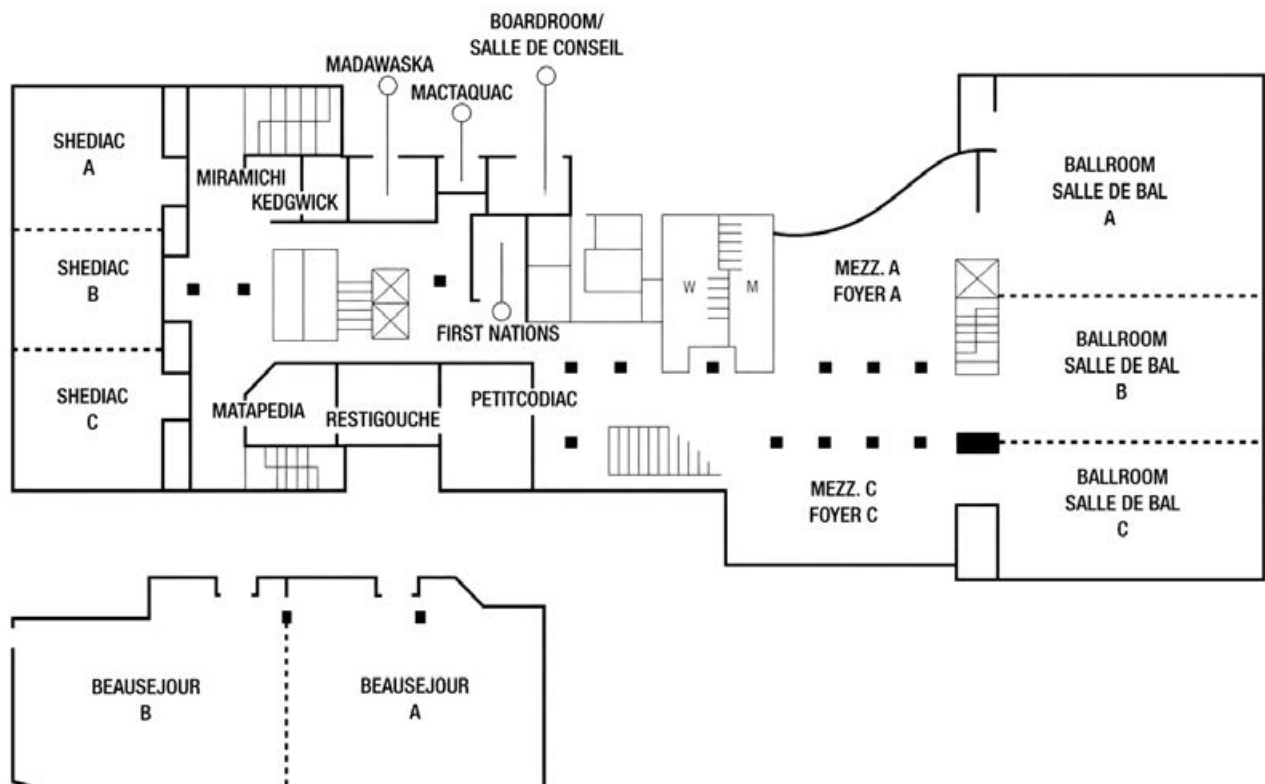
Kara also manages the program for the National Water and Wastewater Conference and has been instrumental in its growth and success.

TECHNICAL TOURS

A LOT HAS CHANGED IN 10 YEARS...

CITY OF MONCTON WATER TREATMENT FACILITY

In 1998 Veolia Water was contracted to design-build and operate a surface water treatment plant that would address a myriad of water quality problems facing the tri-community of Moncton, Dieppe and Riverview.

In 2017, the year after the ACWWA conference last visited Moncton, the City of Moncton was hit with a cyanobacteria bloom in the watershed. The City of Moncton has since expanded the treatment plant to deal with the cyanobacteria.

The final phase of which is currently under construction and completion is anticipated in Fall 2026.

The technical tour will feature a brief tour of the original plant and in depth tour of the retrofits and expansions including the clarifier retrofits, and the new ozone, hydrogen peroxide and powdered activated carbon systems.

TRANSAQUA WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY

In 2016, when the ACWWA conference last visited Moncton, TransAqua had just begun the \$90 Million upgrade from a chemically-assisted process to an advanced biological removal treatment process. The plant improvements include:

- Upgrades to the existing inlet works building
- A new septage receiving system and building
- Four primary clarifier tanks
- A new biological nutrient removal (BNR) system (four-stage, step-feed) and associated aeration equipment
- A new secondary clarifier tank and retrofitting the three existing primary clarifier tanks to be used as secondary clarifier tanks
- Expansion of the existing dewatering building to include sludge storage tanks and sludge thickening equipment, and solids load-out
- A new ultra-violet disinfection system
- A complete review and restructure of the plant electrical system

The tour will be provided by senior technical personnel of TransAqua who will be able to present a detailed operational discussion of the modernized facility.

Work on the course began in the mid-1920s, and after several years, the first nine holes opened for play. The original clubhouse was located on what is now the #5 tee box, with the first tee situated on a second-floor outdoor balcony featuring a strategically placed driving mat.

After the original clubhouse was destroyed by fire in 1970, the current clubhouse was built in its place.

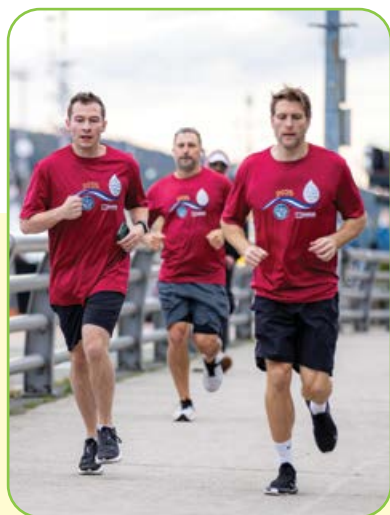
In 1992, superintendent Denny Powers constructed the tree-lined back nine, followed by a redesign of the 13th and 14th holes by golf course architect Graham Cooke in the late 1990s.
